

Crossroads Gun Shows News Flash

Great news for California's lawful gun owners!

U.S. District Court Judge Roger Benitez has ruled that California's ban on magazines with a capacity of more than ten rounds is unconstitutional. This means that the law which required confiscation or surrender of these magazines, which is to go into effect July 1, 2019, will not be enforced until Judge Benitez' decision has been reviewed by the U.S. Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals and, perhaps eventually, the United States Supreme Court.

The U.S. District Court decision is a clear victory for those of us who believe in Second Amendment freedoms. It is not yet clear, however, whether the court's ruling will have any effect on the sales of magazines with a capacity of more than ten rounds. Some legal experts have suggested that the effect of the ruling is limited to the State's ability to enforce the new confiscation law scheduled to go into effect July 1, 2019. Others believe that it invalidates the State's ban on magazines that hold more than ten rounds.

IMPORTANT!

Until we receive a response to our inquires from the California Department of Justice regarding the legality of the sale of magazines with a capacity of more that ten rounds we will not permit them to be sold at Crossroads shows in California.

We are as anxious as you are to have this important question answered. In the interest of ensuring that none of our vendors act in violation of the law we will not permit the sale of magazines with a capacity of more than ten rounds until the questions surrounding the Court's decision have been resolved.

Thanks for your continuing cooperation with our show rules and with applicable laws. This is a developing story. We will keep you posted with future updates.
